

Higher Education Infectious Disease Status - Dental Student Form



Introduction

Instructions

- Students are to complete this form as part of their continued enrolment in the Bachelor of Dental Prosthetics.
- This form and evidence of your status (i.e. your blood test rests), are to be provided to TAFE Queensland **PRIOR** to commencement of any clinical Units of Study and/or any patient contact.
 - If you have not submitted this documentation, you will not be allowed to undertake your clinical practice, and may be excluded from the course.
- You are required to maintain a current infectious disease status during your period of study with TAFE Queensland.
 - Should your study extend beyond 5 years, and you have not updated your infectious disease status, then you will be required to submit current evidence of your infectious disease status.

Notifiable Infectious Diseases

Some conditions require urgent notification (indicated in the list below), to enable prompt public health action (other illnesses, both bacterial and viral; for example, invasive meningococcal disease, you may need to contact public health units to undertake contact tracing and provide clearance antibiotics/ medication for eligibility in the clinics).

Notifiable conditions are diagnosed mainly on clinical/ provisional grounds.

- Clinical diagnosis notifiable condition (C) means a notifiable condition— which is diagnosed either fully or predominantly on the basis of clinical evidence, including clinical history and signs and symptoms.
- Provisional diagnosis notifiable condition (P) means a notifiable condition— which can be provisionally diagnosed on the basis of clinical evidence, including clinical history and signs and symptoms; while awaiting laboratory confirmation. Sometimes early notification is required to enable prompt public health action (Qld Health, 26.08.2022)
